# Emma Pask and Bill Risby

Discovered by jazz legend James Morrison at the age of 16, Emma Pask has become one of Australia's favourite voices in Jazz. Her effortless honest stage presence, combined with her powerful vocal ability, leaves audiences spellbound and inspired. Performing an up close and intimate concert this setting is sure to delight as the duo interweave storytelling through timeless swinging jazz standards, upbeat Latin rhythms, tender ballads and, of course, some raucous blues.

Bill Risby started piano at a very early age, and after progressing through classical grades, studied Jazz at the NSW Conservatorium of Music. He is now highly regarded by many as one of the most accomplished pianists in jazz, improvised and popular music. He has toured the world playing his own music, has 12 albums to his name, and is on the Ponca Jazz recording label (Norway), and Universal Music.

This concert presents an eclectic mix of music from various cultures and genres. The band takes the audience on a musical journey, beginning with a lively Swedish contemporary folk cover of Väsen, followed by a sultry French gypsy bossa. The band also showcases their ability to weave together traditional and contemporary sounds, with a Swedish traditional wedding polska.

Emotive performances of French chanson and an original composition inspired by African music highlight the band's musical prowess, while a unique interpretation of Vivaldi's Presto movement from Summer captivates the audience with its distinctive instrumentation. The concert pays homage to the band's roots with a Swedish traditional folk ballad and features beautiful renditions of a Latin American folk ballad from Argentina and an Italian bossa nova.

# Women of Song

#### PRESENTED IN ASSOCIATION WITH MUSICA VIVA AUSTRALIA

Women of Song is an innovative new show, developed by the acclaimed Jessie Lloyd (of Mission Songs Project) including themes of intergenerational practices, singing on and from country, commitment to community, and preserving knowledge in song. It's an intimate celebration of the 'here and now' of Indigenous culture, a rare mix of spontaneous conversation and songs, exploring the modern-day practice and living heart of the 'world's oldest living culture'.

The audience listens in as three First Nations singers have a conversation. Each conversation and each performance will be unique, as the women explore live on stage how their songs preserve the social, cultural, or environmental shifts of a community, and deepen connections to country, genealogy, and custom.
