

Welcome back for Term 3!

Dear Parents, Students and Friends of Gunnedah Conservatorium

It is always lovely when a new term starts and the Conservatorium is once again filled with people and music after the lull of the school holidays.

We are looking forward to another busy term and hope all will embrace their music studies and work hard in their lessons and at home between times.

As a parent I know the struggle of trying to get children to practice. I sometimes too feel that it is not worth the battle. But the 30 minutes in the weekly lessons is a relatively small part in your child's development as a musician. They really need to be supporting their weekly studies with a regular practice at home, involvement in school ensembles where possible and working towards performances (and these could be short performances for families and friends).

I don't have all the answers so here's some advice from Dr Anita Collin's who featured in the ABC series, Don't Stop the Music. This was based on a beginner 5-year-old student ... most students should be doing at least 15 minutes and building up to longer times especially if preparing for exams or assessments.

1. Five minutes of practice, no more!

Tell your child that they have 5 minutes MAXIMUM a day to practise. See how this changes the psychology of their practice routine. Suddenly they'll want to practise more — but don't let them!

2. Establish a routine

Get used to a particular time of day being practice time, whether it be before dinner or before shower and bed time. Stick to it religiously.

3. A practice space

Make sure your child has a space to practise. It doesn't have to be a room — it can just be a corner. A good tip is to have a little rug that defines the space. It should become the special space that is reserved for this part of your child's life.

4. Bribery

Well who hasn't tried this with their kids? It really works with practising a musical instrument. The bribe can be something simple and basic. Stickers work really well!

I have also found that it helps to be active in your children's practice. My children love practicing with my husband Rory because he also learned piano as a kid and he can help problem solve. I find if I can ask them to play me something new or what they are working on that also helps.

We have some great events coming up this term and I encourage you to check out the events listed in this newsletter. Please also share with friends and colleagues who may not be directly linked to the Conservatorium.

Also the Gunnedah Conservatorium Annual General Meeting will be held on Friday 13 September so please save that date. Kenny Broberg Recital Tour

Wednesday 28th August @ 7.30pm.



A native of Minneapolis, 23-year-old pianist Kenny Broberg was a top prize winner at the Sydney International Piano Competition and most recently won the silver medal at the 2017 Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in the US.

The first musician in his family, Kenny started piano lessons at age six, when he was first fascinated by his mother's upright—a wedding gift from her parents. He studied for nine years with Dr. Joseph Zins

before entering the University of Houston's Moores School of Music, where he earned a Bachelor of Music degree with Nancy Weems in 2016.

Kenny has previously performed as soloist with the Royal Philharmonic, Minnesota, Sydney Symphony, Seattle Symphony, Dallas Chamber, Fort Worth Symphony, and the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestras, among others, working with conductors Ludovic Morlot, Carlos Miguel Prieto, Leonard Slatkin, Nichola Milton, and Nicholas McGegan. His solo, chamber, and concerto performances have been broadcast on NPR and ABC Classic FM radio, and several of his performances at the 2016 Sydney International Piano Competition were included on CDs released on the Universal Music Australia label.


Gunnedah Conservatorium would also like to invite piano students to an afternoon with Kenny Broberg @ the The Civic, Gunnedah 4-5pm.
